

The Palette: Sunday Gatherings Lighting Operator

Mission: To create a dynamic and engaging worship environment through the operation of theatrical lighting, for people to encounter God and worship Jesus.

Time Commitment: 2 hours on the specific week you're serving

- Commit to serving at least once a month for Sunday gatherings.
- Sundays Gatherings: 8:15-10:30am or 10:30-12:30am or 3:30-5:30pm (depending on which gathering you're serving at)
- Any all-Palette or specific team development outside Sunday Gatherings (celebration nights, Palette Vision Nights, etc.) - Usually on a quarterly or bi-annual basis.
- Optional: on-going training (opportunities provided at least every other month.) Usually after a gathering for 30 mins-1 hr.

Supported by: Lighting Operator Team Leader, Director of Creative Arts.

Personal Responsibilities:

- Seek to grow in relationship with Jesus through the spiritual practices of prayer, worship, and scripture reading.
- Live out the VFC principles of being a Worshiping Community of Missional Theologians.

Ministry Responsibilities

- Arrives 45 minutes (9am) or 30 minutes (11am and evening) before the gathering you're serving at to familiarize yourself with gathering flow and lighting cues
- Pay close attention to every element of the gathering
- Be on time and ready to give God your absolute best at every opportunity
- Ensure lighting transitions are executed correctly.
- Work with Tech Team Lead to fix any errors.
- Flexibility to think quickly on the fly and follow the teaching or music
- Respond promptly to schedule requests
- Be familiar with the gathering flow to anticipate what's coming "up next" and make changes accordingly.
- Be a humble team player, able to receive instruction and feedback. Ability to listen to the Tech Team Lead for cues.
- Attend and participate in all-Palette team and vision nights.
